Miller, Pinner and Sampson and Marshal Nichols.

The minutes of yesterday were read, approved and signed.

The committee on the claim of E.G. Sugg for \$100.00 for work on the levee east of

his Hotel reported adversely to all owing him any pay on that account. And said report

was received and concurred in.

The rate of taxes on property of every description taxed by the state for the year

1872 is levied by unanimous vote of the Board at thirty cents on each \$100.00. And the

Recorder is directed to prepare the Tax Book by next meeting.

On motion thus H. Kelley's account for jailers fees (boarding Sherrington) for

\$12.60 was allowed.

On motion Deberry and Baker's account for an ax and nails for \$2.50 was by the

Board allowed.

On motion the "Fire Extinguisher" matter was referred to a special committee, to

wit: Aldermen Deberry, Pinner and Miller with instructions to report in detail on the

subject at the next regular meeting.

On motion the Board adjourned.
