BOARD MEETING January 4, 1881 Court House

The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Dyersburg, Tennessee met at the Court House at Dyersburg on Tuesday night, January 4, 1881 pursuant to adjournment.

Present Mayor C. P. Clark and Aldermen C. L. Nolen, N. Coker, J. M., Nichols, G. E. Scott, E. S. Thurmond and H. Parks, Jr. and Marshal W. H. Loyed.

The minutes of last meeting were read, approved and signed.

The report of the Finance Committee filed at the last meeting of the Board was adopted as satisfactory and ordered spread upon the minutes which report is in the words and figures as follows:

"To the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Dyersburg:

We, your committee appointed to examine the books and vouchers of H. Parks, Jr. Recorder and Treasurer and W. H. Loyed Marshall and to settle with said officers would report as follows:

From the books of the Recorder and Treasurer we find that he has received from all sources the sum of Five Hundred Fifty and 10/100 Dollars and from his vouchers we find that he has paid out Five Hundred Sixty Three and 50/100 Dollars making \$13.30 more paid out than received by him.

From the books of the Marshall we find that he has received for 1878 taxes Four & 75/100 Dollars, for 1879 taxes Two Hundred Fourteen and 25/100 Dollars and 1880 taxes Five Hundred Thirty Nine and 32/100 Dollars and that he has received for fines during this year One Hundred and Seventy Two Dollars making the total receipts by the Marshall Nine Hundred Thirty and 30/100 Dollars from which his vouchers show he has paid out on Mayor's Warrants Six Hundred Sixty Nine and 63/100 Dollars and for other purposes One Hundred and Fifty Five Dollars which with 5% allowance on taxes and fines collected say 5% on \$930.32 = \$46.51 makes amount paid out by him Eight Hundred Seventy One and 14/100 Dollars which amount deducted from his receipts leaves him due this Board Fifty Nine and 18/100 Dollars.

We submit herewith as a part of our report a ????? account with W. H. Loyed marked Exhibit "A" which account shows the names of all persons of whom said Marshall claims to have received taxes and the amount he received from them; the amount of fines received by him as well as the official number of the cases on which said fines were received and it also shows the amount and official number of the Mayor's warrants paid by him which warrants have been cancelled in settlement today.

Your committee find from the books of the Recorder and Treasurer that several parties are in arrears for their Privilege Tax and would therefore recommend that all past due privilege taxes be collected without further delay.

to Ballot for Recorder & Treasurer to serve during the year 1881, which ballot resulted in

the election of Alderman N. C. White to serve the present year as Recorder and Treasurer

for the Town of Dyersburg and thereupon was declared by the Mayor to be duly elected to

fill said office.
