

BOARD MEETING
January 18, 2006
Court House

Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met at the Court House on Monday January 18, 1886.

Present Mayor Thomas, Aldermen Watkins, Turner, Sinclair, Brackin and Hayes – Marshal E. L. Smith.

Petition was presented from citizens asking that a walk be built to the college building.

On motion a committee was appointed to have said walk built as soon as possible, Turner, Brackin, Sinclair.

On motion following fire ordinance was passed, to-wit: Be it enabled by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of Dyersburg that it shall be the duty of the fire warden of Dyersburg to regulate the storage of gun powder, coal oil and all other combustible explosive or inflammable material, and the use of lights, candles, lamps, stove pipes, chimneys and flues in all store houses, dwellings, out houses, shops, stables and all other houses and all parties after having five days notice to suppress, regulate or repair same, if they fail to do so shall be arrested by the Marshal and if found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be fined not less than one dollar nor more than fifty dollars, and it shall be the duty of the fire warden to repair or tear down, at the expense of the party owning same, after proper notice is served, all chimneys, flues, pipes or other obstructions that hazard the dangers of fire.

Marshal E. L. Smith presented the name of H. L. Nichols for Deputy Marshal for 1886 and on motion H. L. Nichols was elected Deputy Marshal for year 1886 and was duly sworn into office by Mayor Thomas.

On motion Board adjourned.
