On motion committee on extending lease to Oil Company continued – Turner, Smith and Brackin.

On motion horse rack was ordered the committee having reported cost \$53.00.

On motion committee on fire ordinance was discharged they having reported the moving of Burkes show a violation of said ordinance.

On motion Capt. R. A. Burke was requested to raise his privy at least 12 inches higher in order that it may be kept clean and committee on same was discharged.

On motion following accounts were allowed:

On motion committee was appointed to look after the interest of the Corporation in the building of the R. R. Switch – Watkins, Hayes and Turner and B. B. Watkins.

On motion W. R. Hayes was requested to correspond with Ed Kashum in regard to moving his manufacturing here and find out what he discussed the city to do for him.

Mayor Thomas was appointed to have the sewer from Shepards, to wit: fixed so the water would not run in the street.
