DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION – TAX INCENTIVE

The Committee reviewed a propose tax abatement plan to freeze property taxes at the current level on eligible downtown commercial properties where improvements are made that are equal to 50% of the current tax appraised value.

On a motion by Aldermen Norman and Lee the City Board approved the downtown revitalization tax abatement plan.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

Building Committee Chairman James Lee reported on the meeting held July 30, 2004 at 105 St. John Avenue. The Committee reviewed Mr. Mickey Pettie's progress on repairing his house.

On a motion by Aldermen Lee and Dudley, Mr. Pettie was given 90 days to make progress on the repairs necessary to make the property presentable.

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT

Public Safety Committee Chairman Bob Kirk reported on the meeting held July 22, 2004. The Committee reviewed staff recommendations regarding implementation of an EDA Grant.

On a motion by Aldermen Kirk and Guthrie the Board adopted a resolution to terminate a September 23, 2003 EDA contract.

MISC.

<u>Alderman Guthrie</u> announced that First Baptist Church will help coordinate food to be carried to the National Guard Support Day.

Alderman Dean announced that St. Mary's Episcopal Church would also help coordinate
the National Guard Day food. He questioned when the Ozment house on East Court Street
is to be demolished. He reported that the retention basin at the Henry Street water tank
had been repaired. He reported that the city and county government and schools are
looking for a plan to share a grant writer.

<u>Alderman Lee</u> commended the public works employees.
