

BOARD MEETING
Thursday, May 2, 1872
Court House

The Board of Aldermen met at the Court House this evening at candle light.
Present: Mayor Clark, Aldermen Deberry, McAllister, Miller, Pinner, Roberts and Sampson and Marshal Nichols.

Aldermen Miller and Pinner reported in favor of buying a “Gardner Fire Extinguisher” for the use of the Town.

On motion the report was adopted and Alderman Pinner authorized to purchase an extinguisher while on his visit to St. Louis (if satisfied in examination) at the expense of the Board of Aldermen.

On motion the last survey made and marked by E.G. Sugg is adopted as the true survey of the Town.

On motion of Alderman Roberts it is ordered that all fences and temporary buildings be removed out of the streets and alleys by or before the first day of October next.

The account of Stevens Brothers for \$34.75 for lumber was allowed.

The account of E.G. Sugg for \$17.75 for surveying was allowed.

The account of J.E. Roberts for \$5.00 for surveying was allowed.

The account of W.E. Deberry for attention to the streets, to this date this year for \$7.50 was allowed.

Aldermen Roberts, Pinner, and Deberry were appointed a committee to confer with E.G. Sugg and report on the propriety of allowing his claim for work on the levee.

On motion it was ordered that when the Plat of E.G. Sugg’s late survey is prepared it be recorded in the Registers Office.

Ordered that the Board adjourn until tomorrow night.
