

BOARD MEETING
June 7, 1886
Court House

Be it remembered that on Monday night, June 7, 1886 the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met at the Court House in regular session.

Present and presiding Mayor B.L. Thomas, Aldermen Smith, Turner, Sinclair, Brackin and Hayes and Marshal E. L. Smith.

Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

On motion report of committee on walks on St. John Street was received and committee discharged.

On motion committee on widening the street east of B. T. Hartons was continued.

On motion following accounts were allowed, to-wit:

On motion the thanks of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen were tendered P. T. Glass and Mr. Anderson, members of Congress for their efforts in trying to get an appropriation from Congress for the north fork of the Forked Deer River and W. R. Hayes was appointed to let the gentlemen know of the action of the Board.

The whole Board was made a committee to report what work was necessary on Depot Street. Marshal Smith made a report which on motion was read and ordered spread on minutes and is as follows, to-wit:
