Reports from Aldermen:

Aldermen Bob Kirk: Inquired about a timeframe for the audit to be bound for distribution. Mayor Holden stated the binding of the audit was in progress and the city is awaiting a meeting to be scheduled with Kevin Howell representing ATA. Additionally, Mr. Kirk announced that retiring Senator Corker would be attending a coffee and presentation at the Chamber of Commerce, Wednesday, April 4, 2018 at 7:00 a.m. the public is invited to attend.

Alderman Bill Escue: No report.

Alderman Terry Glover: Asked Mike McCulloch about the status of a previously discussed request for repair of yards containing holes over storm drains.

Alderman Kevin Chaney: Asked Mike McCulloch about the status of a storm drain boxes and their need for repair at the intersection Fairway and Club House Drives. He noted that they have been caving in from behind and water had been "scouring Down" over the past year creating quite a hole. He said a caution cone had been placed into the area and various rock and dirt had been placed onto the area to retard the erosion: however, the problem had gotten worst, and needed repair for the safety of people walking near the area. Secondly, he discussed a water leak problem (further around the corner from the prior discussed location) that needs the Street Department to determine where the leak is located for eminent repair. He stated the water had been tested at the lab and it was determined that the water contained fluoride in it; therefore, the water was obviously city water. He asked Mr. McCulloch when he could address the issue. Mr. McCulloch responded he would attempt to address it this week.

Alderman Mike Morgan: Stated that the water testing regarding Alderman Chaney's comments was completed last year and it was determined that the water did contain fluoride. He said it was something to look into.

Alderman Dennis Moody: No report.

Alderman Scott Staggs: No report.

Alderman Robert Taylor, Jr: Announced a community clean-up at both Bruce and Future City areas Saturday, April 7, 2018 with weather permitting. He asked Mayor Holden if they could get trash containers for their trash collection. Mayor Holden responded that would be possible and Alderman Taylor should let him know where and what time for delivery. Additionally, he inquired about local residents repairing some of the playground equipment at Future City due to its bad condition. Mayor Holden stated that that is possible: however, the city would first have to check with the risk insurance carrier for liability purposes to see what the repair entails. Finally, he inquired as to when the Recreation Committee would be meeting as a follow-up to the public hearings. Mayor Holden stated he would try to schedule a meeting at the end of the week.

Communications from the Mayor:

- Announced the April 4, 2018 Dogwood Dash Festival at the Farmer's Market. He encouraged all to attend.
