

Department News.....

July 1, 2009, will start the new plan year for our Flexible Benefit Plan. You will recall this plan allows you to have your eligible insurance premiums taken out of your paycheck before taxes which gives you extra take-home pay. You save at least 22.65% off the cost of your insurance.

Beginning in 1999, plan years became subject to new "Change of Status" rules under new regulations for Cafeteria Plans. You will recall that once you elect to pre-tax your eligible premiums, you cannot change your election for one year UNLESS you have a "Change of Status".

The new rules are outlined in the updated Summary Plan Description. Additionally, proof of the event or changes will be required in some situations when making a change.

We anticipate that for the vast majority of our employees, participation in the Cafeteria Plan will continue to be a wise decision. However, some requests for change will not be acceptable.

Examples:

1. "I can't afford it anymore."

Note 1: This was not acceptable under the old rules. Also, not permitted under new rules.

Note 2: Usually when someone can't afford it anymore, it's due to an event that is acceptable.

2. "My wife/husband found cheaper coverage."

Note 1: Not acceptable under old rules. Also, not permitted under new rules. Again, most cases turned out to be acceptable due to another legitimate reason.

Note 2: Under new rules, ...even if the reason is legitimate ...if eligibility (of either the employee, spouse or dependent) is not affected, no change can be made. (See page 4 of Summary Plan Description)

If you are already participating and wish to continue receiving the tax savings, then you needn't do anything.

All others have the opportunity at this time to:

1. Begin participation
2. Make other changes

Those wishing to begin participation or make changes must see Human Resources no later than June 26, 2009.

If you don't, you cannot participate or make changes for one year (July 1, 2010) UNLESS you have a legitimate reason (qualifying event).

OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR INSURANCE CHANGES

Just a reminder that June is open enrollment month to make changes to your medical/dental insurance. Please take a moment to review your selections from last year and make sure that you don't need to add or delete anyone from your coverage. Remember this is the only month of the year that you can randomly make changes.

The only way changes can be made during the other months is when actual "status changes" occur such as marriages, divorces, births, loss of spouse's job which results in loss of insurance coverage, or children who become ineligible for coverage due to their age.

Celebrating Earth Day at DMS with GIS, Storm Water, & Water Treatment

On May 7th the Dyersburg Middle School 6th grade students participated in “Earth Fest”, an Earth Day Awareness project. Various booths were set up on the campus, including the Water Treatment Plant, Storm Water, and G.I.S. Department. Carmen Cupples and John Murray introduced the students to the GIS at their booth. They were educated on how everyday information can be turned into a powerful tool using a Geographic Information System. Tiffany Parker had the opportunity to spend time with and educate these children about the process of the City’s drinking (potable) water. Thomas Mullins and Kevin Joslin had the opportunity to talk about storm water and the different effects it has on the environment.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

On May 21st, 22nd, and 23rd, 2009 the Dyersburg Fire Department conducted a "Fill-the-Boot" fundraiser. This was to assist a local Boy Scout (Luis Portillo) in pursuit of his Eagle Scout badge. Luis' Eagle Scout project is to raise a monument in memory of two local firefighters who were killed on January 12, 1942. The fundraiser took place at Wal-Mart and Lowes; we would like to thank them greatly for their assistance.

The story of these two men is not as well known as it should be. Hopefully, upon completion of this project all of Dyersburg and Dyer County will know their names.

The following account comes from the monthly periodical "A Page In Time" printed locally by Darrell and Jean Butler. Many hours were spent researching the story.

Firefighter William "Bill" L. Dudley Firefighter Pratt Fletcher

On January 12th, 1942 at 04:49 a.m. the Dyersburg Fire department responded to a reported fire at the "Tennessee Hotel Building and Homer Preslar Furniture Company". The fire was reported by a filling station attendant that Monday morning. The department was located at the end of East Market at that time and the fire was just around the corner on Cedar and Main. Soon after arriving the fire department's log noted that firefighters Richard Newbill and Obie Bishop were seriously burned on their hands and arms when they were trapped in the basement of the building at 05:10 a.m.. They were taken to Baird Brewer Hospital at the North end of Main.

All the residents of the Tennessee Hotel (located on the third floor of the building) were evacuated before the fire spread. The fire continued to spread reaching the Homer Preslar Furniture Company.

Fifty-four minutes into the fire the south wall of the three story Tennessee Hotel collapsed striking three firefighters.

Firefighter William "Bill" Dudley was killed instantly (he was a volunteer fireman who was employed as a plumber by the City Water and Light Dept.).

Firefighter Pratt Fletcher was taken to Baird Brewer Hospital; he sustained head injuries, a crushed chest and a broken leg. He died at 10:00 a.m. that morning.

Firefighter Ollie Marley was also struck by the wall; he sustained a crushed chest, back injuries and a fractured leg. He recovered and returned to work six months later on July 18th.

The DFD and the Chief (Barney Hunter) contained the fire to the two buildings and prevented it from jumping the alley to the Piggly Wiggly Grocery. The department returned to quarters at 8:45 p.m. that night.

Funeral services for FF William "Bill" Dudley were held in the chapel of Curry's Funeral Home at 3:00 p.m. Tuesday, January 13th, 1942. He was survived by his wife, Mrs. Wilma Dudley, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Dudley and a son, William Early Dudley.

Funeral services for FF Pratt Fletcher were held at the First Baptist Church in Dyer, Tennessee at 3:00 p.m. Tuesday, January 13th, 1942. FF Pratt Fletcher had moved to Dyersburg around 1932 and had been employed by the DFD since 1933. He was survived by his, wife Mrs. Mattie Fonville Fletcher, a daughter, Mrs. Leon Fuller, and a son, Boyd Fletcher.

It is planned to have a dedication for the monument in October of 2009, the date will coincide with the "National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service" held in Emmitsburg, Maryland at the National Fire Academy.

The monument will be placed in front of Station 1 for all of Dyersburg and Dyer County to see.

Thanks again to Luis Portillo for his efforts, for including the DFD in this project, and all the guys at the Dyersburg Fire Department for their efforts to help raise the needed funds for the project.

Protect Your Child From Drowning With These Simple Pool Safety Tips

Drowning is one of the major causes of accidents resulting in serious injury and death in children. Parents should not be fooled into thinking that their child is safe just because he/she knows how to swim. In a lot of these cases accidents happened even though the child knew swimming. Accidents in the swimming pool can happen very suddenly without warning. It is very important that all parents follow these basic safety precautions especially if there is a swimming pool at home.

1. Never allow your youngster to swim alone without any adult supervision. It is quite common to develop a cramp underwater, or for accidents like hitting your head while diving for example, to occur. It is paramount that there should be persons around to help in such situations.
2. Do not allow children with no knowledge of swimming in or around the pool. For good pool safety make sure that all kids above the age of 4 attend a certified swimming class, or at least learn basic flotation techniques and life saving techniques in case of accidents. Children younger than 4 should always be accompanied by their parents in the pool.
3. Enclose your pool with high fences, which can be locked. Do not leave the pool open and accessible since children can fall inside. Keep your pool safe, and keep your kids away from the poolside.
4. Avoid leaving your kids alone even with small portable pools or water bodies like buckets, fountains, and barrels. There is always a danger of drowning occurring even in small bodies of water.
5. In case of a backyard swimming pool, make sure that the cover of the pool is completely lifted over the pool. Do not partially open the pool. Also make sure that your child does not walk over the pool cover.
6. Spas and Hot Tubs must also be avoided, especially in the case of younger children who are susceptible to overheating.
7. For good pool safety, you can make sure that there is always a life saving flotation device handy near the pool. Also, every parent should be conversant in basic CPR techniques in case of any accident.
8. The last, but not the least, to ensure swimming pool safety, be observant; Watch your kids.





Frank Thomas Maynard, July 25, 1975.

Not everyone who wanted to was able to attend the celebration of the National Law Enforcement Officers Day Memorial including many the Dyersburg/Dyer Co. Police officers and Sheriff's deputies; many were on duty, keeping peace within our community, our county and around our United States. The career this populace has chosen doesn't come with bankers' hours or days "the company" can close during the week or holidays. Such is the life of a peace officer, whether he/she is with the Police Dept., Sheriff's Office, the Highway Patrol, T.B.I., F.B.I. or any other law enforcement agency. These extraordinary individuals; many more of them women in recent times, put more than their lives on the line to keep the peace in others' lives while their families' lives are put on hold. 

Need help paying for college?
DO THE TWO STEP!
*There is money for college but you must
 complete the process...*



Complete the FAFSA. Money for college is available, but to receive it, particularly if you are hoping for federal or state funding like the Pell Grant, you must first fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This 6 page form prepared by the US Education Dept. is used by the government to assess student need in awarding financial aid.

Like many government forms, the FAFSA is long. It is complicated. Filing it can be intimidating. But, to be considered for many grants, scholarships, or other types of financial aid, the FAFSA must be completed and filed.

Help is available. Local help with filing the FAFSA is available at DSCC's Financial Aid office. They know first hand how difficult filing the FAFSA can be. Staff members are there to help and are trained to walk students and their parents through the application. Their One-Stop Center on the campus is set up so that a student can apply to the college, then make their financial aid application. They work every day with first-time students and their parents to help them through the maze of paperwork.

Submit requested verification materials to DSCC One-Stop. After a student has filed their FAFSA, they must submit verification materials if their application is selected by the federal processor for verification of the information submitted. Students will receive a letter from the Financial Aid Office informing them what they need to submit. It is imperative that students complete this last, yet necessary, step as soon as possible to prevent delays in the financial aid processing for the Fall 2009 semester.

FAFSA forms must be filed online. Complete information about the FAFSA, including the application forms, is available at www.fafsa.ed.gov. In addition, the DSCC web site (www.dsc.edu) has complete information about the financial aid process posted. Click on "financial aid" on the landing page. For students attending or interested in attending Dyersburg State who need assistance, please contact the DSCC One-Stop at 731-286-3350 or Director of Financial aid Sandra Rockett at 731-286-3238.
