# MAYOR'S OFFICE

I would like to congratulate Bobby Baker and his staff for the great job they did with the recent Dyersburg Municipal Golf Course City Championship. The finals were held on August 19<sup>th</sup> and there was a great crowd on hand to watch the matches. I would also like to thank all of those that competed and those that volunteered to cook and serve on the day of the event. A great time was had by all!

Speaking of the golf course, the revenue for the month of July was \$46,016.43. We went back over the past 5 years records for the golf course and this was the highest producing month of revenue. This was a 32% increase over July 2008. There have also been many improvements at the course, if you get a chance, please visit and play a round or two. I think you will be impressed with the progress that has been made.

I would also like to update you on the progress we have made at the City of Dyersburg Landfill. As many of you know, the City for a long time, has needed additional customers and revenue to improve the bottom line with the Solid Waste Department. We were fortunate in January to reach an agreement with a company to bring additional tonnage to the landfill. To date, this has accounted for an increase in revenue of \$217,410.39. I would like to thank John Damesworth and his staff for the great job they are doing in this department.

A very special thanks goes out to a group of dedicated volunteers who have worked tirelessly over the past two years to bring The Big River Bowl to Dyersburg. This group of volunteers known as Team Dyersburg is to be commended for their efforts in making this dream a reality. As many of you know, the game was played at Dyersburg High School and featured the Georgetown College Bengals and the William Penn Statesmen. Georgetown won the game 22-14 in front of a large crowd at J.C. Sawyer Stadium. It was a great football game and I heard many compliments from the coaches, team players and their fans. Great job Team Dyersburg!! I would also like to thank the Kiwanis Club and Rotary Clubs of Dyersburg for preparing breakfast Saturday morning for the teams and their staffs. Also to those that sponsored, contributed, worked or supported this endeavor, your contribution is greatly appreciated.

There are many events taking place in September, please look for these and participate when you can. I am personally excited about the opening of the 62<sup>nd</sup> annual Dyer County Fair. The fair will open on September 7<sup>th</sup> and this years theme is "There is Magic in the Air at The Dyer County Fair." 
An OSHA recordable injury is an occupational injury or illness that requires medical treatment more than simple first aid/ diagnostic procedures. Examples are sutures, filling a prescription drug, time off, work restrictions, etc. Simple First Aid is not OSHA recordable even though an accident report is filled out. So far this year we are down on our OSHA recordable accidents. You can compare by looking at the chart below. **GOOD JOB!**

Soon there will be a safety training system in place which will allow city employees at their convenience to access a computer software training program which is OSHA approved. On completion of a course a certificate will be received and a copy turned into Human Resources.

The Safety Committee is working on a safety program for the City employees. This is an incentive for the employees to help reduce accidents. More information is included in the newsletter.

## ***Candle Fire Safety Use Candles with Care Candle Statistics***



Candles cause an estimated 15,600 fires in residential structures, 150 deaths, 1,270 injuries, and \$539 million in estimated direct property damage each year.

Over half (55%) of home candle fires start because the candle is too close to some combustible material.

More candle fires (38%) begin in the bedroom than in any other room.

Falling asleep is a factor in 12% of home candle fires and 26% of the associated deaths.

Half of all civilian candle fire deaths occur between Midnight and 6 am.

December is the peak month for candle fires; Christmas is the peak day.

Young children and older adults have the highest death risk from candle fires.

The risk of a fatal candle fire appears higher when candles are used for light.

### **Tragic and Preventable Candle Fires**

Three sleeping boys died when a candle left burning in the living room ignited nearby combustibles.

A man and his three children died in a fire when hot wax from an unattended candle dripped on curtains, igniting them.

Eleven members of a family died in a fire when a lighted candle ignited a mattress.

Two children died in a fire when a lighted candle rolled under the Christmas tree.

A mother and young baby died when a burning candle used for religious observances ignited cabinetry.

Fact: The majority of candle fires result from human error and negligence.

### **Candle Fire Safety Tips**

#### **Avoid using lighted candles.**

If you do use candles, ensure they are in sturdy metal, glass, or ceramic holders and placed where they cannot be easily knocked down.

Keep candles out of the reach of children and pets.

Set a good example by using matches, lighters, and fire carefully.

Children should never be allowed to play with matches, lighters, or candles.

Never put candles on a Christmas tree.

Never leave the house with candles burning.

Extinguish candles after use.

Establish a fire-safe home, especially a safe sleeping environment.

And NEVER leave burning candles unattended!

## HEALTH INSURANCE REMINDERS

If you have dependent children (19 and over) who are starting to college and will be covered under your health insurance plan, please remember to get a certificate/letter from the administration office verifying that they are full-time students. Bring this certificate to the Human Resources office so we can notify Underwriters. This will allow Underwriters to pay your dependent's claims at the network rate in case they are out of town and cannot get to a network physician.

This certificate must be obtained at the beginning of each semester of school for which your dependent signs up. If you have other questions, please contact the Human Resources Department.

## **RETIREMENT PLAN INFORMATION**


**Can I borrow money from my City retirement account?**

No. Your City retirement account is not a 401K or a defined contribution plan that goes up or down with the stock market. It is a defined benefit plan that grows in value each month you participate. We do not have a daily value of your account.

An accurate calculation of the value is based on multiple factors (time in plan, salary earned, vested interest).

All account calculations for payout are done by an actuary at a cost of \$125.00 to the plan.

You can withdraw your money from the plan if you qualify for a hardship withdrawal due to mortgage foreclosure or excessive medical bills. You would receive all of your contributions plus interest plus any vested portion of the City's contribution. You would be terminated from the plan with no opportunity to re-enter as long as you are continuously employed.



## **Water/Sewer and Water Treatment**

Friday August 14th, 2009 was an interesting night for the Water/Sewer Dept. and Water Plants. Around 11 p.m. a Water Plant employee noticed that the RoEllen Tank had fallen drastically within the hour, so much so, that it was completely empty. The RoEllen Tank holds 50,000 gallons of water, That's a lot of water to lose in an hour.

The cause; a fire hydrant had been hit by a truck and was broken at the base. During the middle of the night many RoEllen residents were unaware, (except for the that air came out of their faucets that morning) that they had been out of water. A few residents helped locate where the damaged fire hydrant was by calling in low water pressure to the EOC. Thanks to the Water/Sewer crew on call that night and Water Plant Employees who were working, residents in the RoEllen area had their water service returned before they woke up the next morning.

The Safety Committee would like to introduce a new program that rewards those employees who work safe and practice good safety work habits.


