Board of Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met at Court House on Friday night, January 18, 1884.

Present Mayor Thomas, Aldermen Pinner, Smith, Jones, Baker, Watkins and Hayes and Marshal Thurmond.

Minutes of last meeting read, approved and signed.

On motion Bonds of Recorder Hayes and Marshal J. P. Thurmond were read and ordered spread on minutes when approved and ordered signed by Mayor.

W. R. Hayes Bond

Know all men by these presents, that we, W. R. Hayes, principal and M. M. Marshal and Jno. W. Wilson securities are held and firmly bound unto the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Dyersburg, Tennessee in the plural sum of Three Thousand Dollars for the payment of which we bind ourselves, our heirs, representatives and administrators jointly and severally firmly by the presents. But the conditions of the above bond is such that whereas the above bound W. R. Hayes has been elected Recorder & Treasurer for Town of Dyersburg for the year 1884.

Now, therefore, should the said W. R. Hayes faithfully discharge said duties faithfully, collect and account for all monies that should come into his hand, then this bond shall be null and void otherwise to remain in full force and effect January 8, 1884.

But the condition of the above bond is such that whereas the above bound J. P. Thurmond has been elected Marshall for the said Town of Dyersburg for the year 1884. Now, therefore should the said J. P. Thurmond faithfully collect and account for all monies that should come into his hands as Marshal, then this bond shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
