April 1, 1884
Court House

Board of Mayor and Aldermen for Town of Dyersburg met at Court House on Tuesday night, April 1, 1884.

Present Mayor Thomas, Aldermen Jones, Smith, Pinner, Baker, Hayes and Marshal Thurmond.

Minutes of previous meetings read, approved and signed.

On motion committee on R. R. switch allowed further time to make final report.

On motion committee to report on law in regard to raising privilege tax was allowed further time.

Marshall Thurmond's report was read and ordered filed with papers – leaving cash in his hands \$50.00.

On motion A. B. Jones was appointed to investigate the horse hurt by falling through bridge with Mr. Smith and to use his discretion in paying the sixty dollars damages claimed or pay seventy five and take the horse for the Corporation.

On motion the Mayor and Marshal were instructed to have the alley in rear of Bank of Dyersburg worked. On motion Smith, Jones, Watkins, Pinner and Baker were appointed to investigate the street scraper offered for sale by Miss Jackson & Nichols and if in their judgment it suits and the Corporation is in need of it to purchase the same.

On motion J. C. Pinner was appointed cemetery commissioner on salary of twenty five dollars (\$25.00) per annum.
